INITIAL DECISION

PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

On November 19, 2014, Brenda Teneyck (“Employee”) submitted a petition for appeal to the Office of Employee Appeals (“OEA”) contesting the District of Columbia Department of Employment Services (“Agency”) action of suspending her from service for thirty days. Employee’s position of record was Unemployment Compensation Claims Examiner. This matter was initially assigned to Administrative Judge (“AJ”) Stephanie Harris. This matter was reassigned to the Undersigned AJ on or around September 2015. A Status conference was scheduled to be held on December 3, 2015.
