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INITIAL DECISION

INTRODUCTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On January 19, 2005, Employee, an Administrative Officer, Primary Care and Prevention Administration, filed a Petition for Appeal from Agency's action removing him from his position for Conduct That Threatens the Integrity of Government Operations.
