INITIAL DECISION

INTRODUCTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Employee filed a Petition for Appeal with the Office of Employee Appeals ("OEA") on November 29, 2021, challenging the District of Columbia Department of Forensic Sciences' ("Agency") Reduction-in-Force, which abolished her position. Pursuant to a letter issued by OEA on December 6, 2021, Agency's Answer was due on or before January 6, 2022. Agency filed a Motion to Dismiss on December 28, 2021.
